

On the cover

As the biography on page 26 of this program amply demonstrates, John Macfarlane is one of the most accomplished set and costume designers practicing today, his work having appeared not only in the major opera houses of the world, but also at a wide range of theater and dance companies. His visionary Macbeth at Lyric last season is just one example of his recent triumphs. Macfarlane also enjoys a successful career as a painter and printmaker, and the painting on the cover encapsulates his exceptional talent. Reproduced at enormous scale, it serves as a drop curtain for this Hansel and Gretel production. Does the image hold the promise of domestic comfort? "This is very much the idea of a plate and knife and fork ready for food—but white and empty," Macfarlane says. "The lack of anything on the plate conveys starvation." Indeed, hunger is a main driving force of the opera, the impulse that sets the characters in motion and places them in peril. For the artist, though, the imagery has proven fruitful. "It inspired a long sequence of plate and cutlery paintings in oil," he says, "which still continues to develop today."

The Final Auditions for Ensemble singer positions ${\operatorname{in}}$

The Patrick G. and Shirley W . Ryan Opera Center take place every year, but their recurring nature does nothing to diminish the intensity of the occasion. Over the course of six hours, one by one, emerging opera talents from around the globe take Lyric Opera of Chicago's Ken Pigott stage, hoping the outcome will be an invitation to join one of the finest artist-development programs in the world.

A variety of factors is at play: which current Ensemble members will be returning for another year (they have to re-audition for their spot, as well) and what roles could be assigned in the upcoming season, for example, but as the program's Director of Vocal Studies Julia Faulkner says, "What we're really looking for is extraordinary talent that needs to be nurtured." The specific number that the program will take on, she says, "is not predetermined. We generally aim for 12 singers in the Ensemble, which would include two of each voice type—soprano, mezzo-soprano, tenor, baritone, bass—plus two additional artists. But where we land is guided by the talent and the potential we hear and see."

The current 2022/23 Ensemble amply demonstrates the results of that approach: there is just one mezzosoprano, and four tenors—an unusual mix that came about because at last season's auditions two tenors wowed the judging panel.

The focus on talent is not the only exceptional aspect of the *Final Auditions*: No matter where they're coming from, each participant's trip to Chicago is provided by the Ryan Opera Center, including travel and lodging, thanks to generous sponsors and American Airlines, Lyric's Official Airline. Typically the singers (and also candidates for the new positions of conductor/pianist, stage director, and stage manager, whose audition process is different and takes place separately) fly in for a three- or four-day stay, during which they meet and work with Ryan Opera Center staff and receive coaching sessions to prepare for their audition. With 15 or 20 candidates arriving to audition in any given year, the expenses are considerable.

Covering the auditioning artists' costs is simply the right thing to do, says Lyric General Director, President

& CEO Anthony Freud. "I've sat on many competition juries over the years, and some of them not only do not cover the travel and lodging expenses of the singers who enter, but even in certain cases singers have to pay to enter," Freud notes. "And that, to me, is completely wrong. If competitors aren't fully reimbursed, how can we talk about inclusivity? It's incredibly important that a commitment to inclusivity includes affordability."

Inclusivity and access are key components of the audition process from the very start, says Ryan Opera Center Director Dan Novak. It begins with promotional efforts. Every January, in a wide variety of traditional ways, the Ryan Opera Center announces that singer applications may be submitted. Numerous websites and publications publicize the opportunity, but Lyric supplements its efforts with an eye toward the company's broader efforts in Inclusion, Diversity, Equity, and Access (IDEA).

"We want the process to be as absolutely open and accessible as possible," Novak says. "Applying for the Ryan Opera Center is free of charge, and we send marketing materials to universities and schools where there are historically diverse student bodies. In the group of Historically Black Colleges and Universities, for instance, there are 23 music programs to which we send the audition announcement, encouraging their students to apply."

Ongoing improvements in technology have made video-recorded submissions far more useful than in the past—which, in turn, has expanded the pool of applicants to a global scale. In any given year, the Ryan Opera Center will review somewhere between 400 and 500 videos. "We listen to all applicants and determine who advances to a preliminary live audition," Novak says. "That narrows the number down to somewhere between 150 to 200 singers, whom we hear in New York City and in Chicago over the course of the spring and summer."

As large-scale as all that might sound, it actually represents only one facet of how the Ryan Opera Center finds talent. Everyone in Lyric's artistic leadership is listening and keeping an eye out for stars on the rise, wherever their work takes them—to universities, performances, and festivals all over the world. That's the less formal part of the company's outreach efforts, which Novak refers to simply as "recruitment."

"It's a year-long and ongoing process," Faulkner notes. "Over the past summer, I heard about 90 different singers—not just heard, but worked with for an hour. I was in Santa Fe, I was in San Francisco, I was in England."

It's much the same for Craig Terry, the Ryan Opera Center's Music Director. "I curated a big concert in Santa Barbara over the summer, with about 25 really gifted singers," he says. "There was one very young

singer there who had a real spark and was able to deliver something that wowed everyone. So we invited her to the *Finals*. Giving her the chance to walk through the door and see what she can do right now was a huge opportunity."

This past September, 15 singers made the pilgrimage for what Freud recently referred to as "the annual excitement." Indeed, the actual day-of performances are thrilling to watch, an experience that first became available to an audience nine years ago, thanks to a sponsorship by the Elizabeth F. Cheney Foundation. This year's Lead Sponsor was Philip G. Lumpkin. "A number of subscribers, donors, patron groups, ticket buyers, and students attend, many for the entire six hours—a

major commitment of time," Novak says. "It's a much nicer experience for the singers to have an audience who support them with their applause and energy. And it's a wonderful opportunity for the Lyric family to learn more about the Ryan Opera Center."

More than 500 listeners attended the most recent event. In the house also, of course, was the judging panel—Faulkner, Freud, Novak, and Terry, joined by Lyric's Music Director Enrique Mazzola, Chief Artistic Administration Officer Matthew Ozawa, Vice President, Artistic Planning Andreas Melinat, and Director of Artistic Programs Cory Lippiello. The conversations, coaching sessions, and interviews that take place with Finalists over the previous several days matter a

great deal, but the final selections are made based on performances by one voice, singing with one piano, on one of the grandest stages anywhere in the world.

Even for a place that is routinely home to extraordinary exhibitions of human talent, the Ryan Opera Center *Final Auditions* make for a special day. The volume of time and energy invested leading up to it, not just from the talented emerging artists but also from the pianists who play the auditions and many other staff at Lyric, can hardly be calculated. Each singer performs their arias, then waits until everyone has had their turn. The judges confer throughout the day, then finish with an intense final session. Once decisions are made, the singers learn the results, and those selected sign their contracts, right on the spot.

This season's auditions resulted in the selection of two mezzo-sopranos, one tenor, and one bass-baritone, who will join the 2023/24 Ensemble's returning eight singers. Those who aren't selected leave with an indelible experience under their belts, and it's not uncommon for them to return at a future date.

"Watching the talent on the stage, the possibilities are endless. And it's always tremendous fun. It makes our blood pressure go up, but it also opens our hearts," says Terry. "Because that's what this career is, what the job is—what is, for all of us, the reason that we're here doing what we do. We want to find artists who can deliver when the pressure is on—who have the ability to connect. Singers who can stand in front of the audience and light it up."



Synopsis

TIME | Once upon a ...

PLACE | A forest near the Ilsenstein, a sinister rock that
in German folklore was said to be the home of witches.

ACT I

In the broom-maker's house

Hansel complains he is hungry. Gretel shows him some milk that a neighbor has given for the family's supper. The children dance. Their mother returns and wants to know why they have got so little work done. She accidentally spills the milk and chases the children out into the woods to pick strawberries. Their father returns home drunk. He brings out the food he has bought, then asks where the children have gone. The mother tells him that she has sent them into the woods. He tells her about the Witch and that the children are in danger. They go out into the woods to look for them.

ACT II

In the woods

Hansel picks strawberries. Hansel and Gretel hear a cuckoo singing and eat the strawberries. Soon they have eaten every one. In the sudden silence of the wood, Hansel admits to Gretel that he has lost the way. The children grow frightened. The Sandman comes to bring them sleep, sprinkling sand over their eyes. The children say their evening prayer. In a dream, they see 14 angels.

INTERMISSION

ACT III

The gingerbread house

The Dew Fairy comes to waken the children. Gretel wakes Hansel, and they see the gingerbread house. They do not notice the Witch. The Witch decides to fatten Hansel up. The oven is hot. Gretel breaks the Witch's spell and sets Hansel free. When the Witch asks her to look in the oven, she pretends she doesn't know how—the Witch must show her. When the Witch peers into the oven, the children shove her inside and shut the door. The oven explodes. The gingerbread children come back to life. The mother and father find the children, and all express gratitude for their salvation.

SAMANTHA HANKEY | HANSEL Lyric debut

The mezzo-soprano opened her 2022/23 Season as Federico García Lorca in Golijov's *Ainadamar* at Scottish Opera and later this

season reprises the role of Dorabella in Così fan tutte at Palm Beach Opera, before making her role and house debut as Mélisande in Pelléas et Mélisande at Santa Fe Opera. This year, Hankey will make her solo recital debut at Carnegie Hall, in a program of Zemlinsky, Strauss, and Ravel. In 2021/22 she made house and role debuts at the Gran Teatre del Liceu Barcelona as Der Komponist in Ariadne auf Naxos, Dorabella at San Diego Opera, and Ruggiero in Glyndebourne Festival's new production of Alcina. She made her role debut as Prince Charmant in Cendrillon at the Metropolitan Opera and her house debut in the same role at the Opéra national de Paris, before returning to Munich's Bayerische Staatsoper as Cherubino in Le nozze di Figaro and Octavian in Der Rosenkavalier, in the new production by Barrie Kosky. From 2019 to 2021, Hankey held a Fest contract at the Bayerische Staatsoper where she appeared as Hansel in Hansel and Gretel, Wellgunde in Das Rheingold, Zweite Dame in Die Zauberflöte, and as Carmen in Marina Abramović's new production of 7 Deaths of Maria Callas at the Opernfestspiele. Other recent significant house debuts include Opernhaus Zürich, Den Norske Opera, The Dallas Opera, and Grand Théâtre de Genève. On the concert stage, Hankey has performed the title role in Handel's Agrippina in concert with Il Pomo d'Oro in Turku, Finland, appeared at Bard Festival in Lili Boulanger's Faust et Hélène, and sang at Carnegie Hall in Handel's Messiah.



HEIDI STOBER | GRETEL

Previously at Lyric: Dalinda/Ariodante (2018/19) and Valencienne/The Merry Widow (2015/16).

Since her acclaimed debut as Pamina/*Die Zauberflöte* at Deutsche Oper Berlin in 2008,

the soprano has cultivated a long-standing relationship with the company, with recent roles including her debut as Eva/Die Meistersinger von Nürnberg, Gretel/Hansel and Gretel, Donna Elvira/Don Giovanni, Micaëla/Carmen, Marguerite/Faust, and Oscar/Un ballo in maschera. At Semperoper Dresden her roles include Fiordiligi/Così fan tutte, title role/Alcina, Micaëla/Carmen, and Adina/L'elisir d'amore, and she has also appeared as Adina for the Wiener Staatsoper. Stober made her Metropolitan Opera debut in the 2011/12 Season as Gretel, returning to the company in recent years as Gretel, Pamina, Oscar, and most recently Despina/Così fan tutte. She appears regularly at San Francisco Opera where roles include Norina, Gretel, Magnolia/Showboat, Oscar, Johanna/Sweeney Todd, Nannetta/Falstaff, Atalanta/Xerxes,

and Susanna/Le nozze di Figaro. For Houston Grand Opera, her roles include Cleopatra/Giulio Cesare, Susanna, Musetta/La bohème, Atalanta, Drusilla/L'incoronazione di Poppea, Norina/Don Pasquale, and most recently Micaëla. This season's highlights include her role debut as Blanche/Dialogues of the Carmelites for San Francisco Opera, Despina for Hamburgische Staatsoper, Susanna for Semperoper Dresden, and Donna Elvira at Japan's Hyogo Performing Arts Center. Future plans include a return to the Metropolitan Opera and her debut at the Royal Opera House, Covent Garden.



JILL GROVE | THE WITCH

Previously at Lyric: 14 appearances since 2003/04, most recently Governess/*The Queen of Spades* (2019/20) and Marthe/*Faust* (2017/18).

This season, the American mezzo-soprano makes her Portland Opera debut as Ježibaba/Rusalka and joins Opera Omaha as Principessa/Suor Angelica. Last season, she performed with Arizona Opera as Madame Armfeldt/A Little Night Music and also returned to the Metropolitan Opera for Elektra and The Rake's Progress. The soprano, a third-year Ryan Opera Center member from Puebla, Mexico, sang in *Sunday in the Park with Lyric* this summer. This season at Lyric, Vélez will also appear in *Carmen*. She was a national winner of the Metropolitan Opera's 2020 Eric and Dominique Laffont Competition. In Mexico's most important platform for rising talent, the National Singing Contest Carlo Morelli, her performance earned her the First Prize, the French Opera award, and the Francisco Araiza Special Award. In Spring 2021, she sang in the Harris Theater's *Beyond the Aria* series alongside Joyce DiDonato, and previously appeared in Lyric's 2020/21 virtual programs *Pasión Latina, Sole e Amore, Magical Music Around the World*, and *Rising Stars in Concert. UNITING VOICES CHICAGO

Previously at Lyric: 14 productions since 2000/01, most recently *Tosca* (2021/22) and *The Queen of Spades* (2019/20).

Uniting Voices Chicago (Josephine Lee, president and artistic director), formerly Chicago Children's Choir, is the nation's preeminent youth choral organization, serving 5,200 students across the city of Chicago. Founded in Hyde Park in direct response to the Civil Rights Movement in 1956, UVC has grown from one choir into a vast network of in-school and after-school programs driven by one mission: to inspire and change lives through music. UVC has impacted the lives of more than 50,000 diverse youth throughout its 62-year history. Since its founding, UVC has focused on building programs that reflect the racial and economic diversity of Chicago. Eighty percent of youth served are from low-moderate income homes, with over 4,000 students annually participating completely free of charge. All singers in UVC programs receive some level of subsidy. High school seniors enrolled in UVC have a 100% graduation and college acceptance rate, becoming global ambassadors who carry on UVC's core values in a wide array of professional fields.



SIR ANDREW DAVIS | CONDUCTOR

One of the world's most acclaimed conductors, Sir Andrew Davis served as music director of Lyric Opera of Chicago from 2000 through the 2020/21 Season. Since his debut engagement

at Lyric in the 1987/88 Season, he has conducted nearly 700 opera performances here, plus numerous special concerts, including the majority of Lyric's free concerts in Millennium Park. The vast repertoire he has led at Lyric encompasses operas by Berg, Berlioz,

Bizet, Britten, Dvořák, Gilbert and Sullivan, Gounod, Janáček, Lehár, López, Massenet, Mozart, Mussorgsky, Poulenc, Puccini, Rossini, Strauss, Tchaikovsky, Verdi, Wagner, and Weinberg. His special performance of Beethoven's Symphony No. 9 last season marked the first time the work was performed on the Lyric stage.

During the 2019/20 Season, Sir Andrew conducted *The Barber of Seville* and *The Queen of Spades* at Lyric. Other recent highlights include appearances with the Toronto Symphony Orchestra (numerous works including most prominently Massenet's *Thaïs*), Washington's National Symphony Orchestra (Handel's *Messiah* in Sir Andrew's own orchestration), and the Chicago Symphony Orchestra (Tippett and Beethoven). Sir Andrew returns to the Toronto Symphony Orchestra this spring for the world premiere of Emilie LeBel's *the sediments* and works of Strauss and Beethoven.

From 2013 to 2019 Maestro Davis served as principal conductor of the Melbourne Symphony Orchestra. Since December 2019 he has continued his artistic role there as conductor laureate. Among his major achievements in the 2018/19 Season were performances of *Idomeneo*, a new production of *Siegfried*, and the company premiere of *Cendrillon* at Lyric; Duruflé's *Requiem* with Royal Liverpool Philharmonic; *Götterdämmerung* at the Edinburgh International Festival; and Elgar's *The Music Makers* at the BBC Proms.

Maestro Davis's career spans nearly five decades, during which he has been the artistic leader at several of the world's most distinguished opera and symphonic institutions, including the BBC Symphony Orchestra (conductor laureate; chief conductor, 1989-2000); Glyndebourne Festival Opera (music director, 1988-2000); and the Toronto Symphony Orchestra (conductor laureate; principal conductor, 1975-1988), where he served as interim artistic director 2018 through 2020. In addition, he holds the honorary title of conductor emeritus at the Royal Liverpool Philharmonic Orchestra.

Sir Andrew has led performances at many of the world's most important opera houses, among them the Metropolitan Opera, La Scala, London's Royal Opera House, the Bayreuth Festival, and the major companies of Munich, Paris, San Francisco, and Santa Fe. In addition to those ensembles, he has appeared with virtually every other internationally prominent orchestra, including the Berlin Philharmonic, Royal Concertgebouw Orchestra, Orchestre de Paris, and all the major British orchestras.

In 1992, Maestro Davis was made a Commander of the British Empire, and in 1999 he was designated a Knight Bachelor in the New Year Honours List.



RICHARD JONES |
ORIGINAL DIRECTOR

Previously at Lyric: Five productions since 2000/01, most recently *The Queen of Spades* (2019/20) and *Ariodante* and *La bohème* (both 2018/19).

The British director debuted at London's Royal Opera House directing the acclaimed 1994 *Ring* cycle. He has returned for eight productions, most recently *Katya Kabanova*. Among his 11 opera productions this season are *L'enfant et les sortilèges* (Paris), *Ariodante* (Valencia), and *Jephtha* (Berlin). Other major productions have included *Hansel and Gretel* (Welsh National

Opera, Metropolitan Opera); The Trojans (English National Opera); Falstaff, Macbeth, and Flight (Glyndebourne); Pelléas et Mélisande and Lohengrin (Munich); Peter Grimes (La Scala); and La bohème (Bregenz). Jones's work in theater includes The Hairy Ape (Old Vic and New York—nominated for six Drama Desk Awards); The Trial, Public Enemy, The Government Inspector, Annie Get Your Gun, and The Good Soul of Szechuan (all for the Young Vic); and productions for the Royal Shakespeare Company, National Theatre, London's West End, and Broadway. A Tony nominee, Jones is the winner of five Olivier Awards. He was appointed a Commander of the British Empire in 2015.



ERIC EINHORN |
REVIVAL DIRECTOR

Previously at Lyric: I puritani (2017/18) and Hansel and Gretel (2012/13).

Einhorn is the co-founding General & Artistic Director of On Site Opera, the country's only opera company dedicated to site-specific productions. He has created partnerships with venues and institutions throughout New York City that range from community gardens, historic homes, and restaurants, to the American Museum of Natural History and the Metropolitan Museum of Art. Among the numerous productions he has created for On Site are Rhoda and the Fossil Hunt (world premiere), Amahl and the Night Visitors, Morning Star, The Turn of the Screw, Murasaki's Moon (world premiere), and La finta giardiniera. For Lyric Unlimited in 2014/15, he directed and coadapted The Property, and in 2018/19 he directed Rhoda and the Fossil Hunt for Opera in the Neighborhoods. Elsewhere, Einhorn has directed at many of the country's leading opera houses, including the Metropolitan Opera (Hansel and Gretel, La cenerentola, Rigoletto), Glimmerglass Festival (Così fan tutte), Pittsburgh Opera (Xerxes, Dialogues des Carmélites, Don Pasquale), Fort Worth Opera (Giulio Cesare), Wolf Trap Opera (Alcina, Così fan tutte), Florentine Opera (Turandot), Austin Opera (Der fliegende Holländer, Dialogues des Carmélites), Utah Opera (Fidelio), and Detroit Opera (Brundibár). He has also created new productions of Tosca, Turandot, and Orff's Carmina Burana for the Pacific Symphony.



JOHN MACFARLANE | SET AND COSTUME DESIGNER

Previously at Lyric: Five productions since 2001/02, most recently *Macbeth* (2021/22) and *The Queen of Spades* (2019/20).

Among the Scottish designer's extensive opera credits are *Tosca* (Metropolitan Opera), *Benvenuto Cellini* (Geneva), *Hansel and Gretel* (Welsh National Opera, Metropolitan Opera), *The Queen of Spades* (WNO), *War and Peace* and *La clemenza di Tito* (Paris), *Agrippina* (Brussels), *Boris Godunov* (Amsterdam), *Euryanthe* (Glyndebourne), *A Midsummer Night's Dream* (Cologne), *Les Troyens* (English National Opera), *Don Giovanni* (Brussels, San Francisco), *Idomeneo* (Vienna), and *Maria Stuarda* (Metropolitan Opera). At Lyric, Macfarlane also designed *Elektra* (2018/19, 2012/13) and *Rusalka*

(2013/14). He made his Royal Ballet debut in 1985 with *Giselle*. He has since returned regularly to the Royal Opera House, designing Glen Tetley's *La Ronde* and Liam Scarlett's *Asphodel Meadows*, *Sweet Violets, The Age of Anxiety, Frankenstein*, and *Swan Lake* for the Royal Ballet and *Peter Grimes, The Magic Flute, Lady Macbeth of Mtsensk, Gianni Schicchi*, and *L'heure espagnole* for the Royal Opera. His many other ballet designs include *The Nutcracker*, *Le Baiser de la fée*, and *Cinderella* for Birmingham Royal Ballet. In 2019, he was made Designer Laureate of Benois de la Danse. Macfarlane's painting and printmaking are widely exhibited across the UK and Europe. He was created a Chevalier de l'Ordre des Arts et des Lettres in 2006 and in 2021 was awarded Outstanding Creative Contribution by the Critics Circle at the National Dance Awards.

JENNIFER TIPTON | LIGHTING

Previously at Lyric: Eight productions since 1988/89, most recently *The Queen of Spades* (2019/20) and *Elektra* (2018/19, 2012/13).

The American lighting designer is well known for her work in theater, dance, and opera. Her recent opera credits include Ricky Ian Gordon's Intimate Apparel, with libretto by Lynne Nottage, at Lincoln Center. Other recent credits include Barcelona's Gran Teatre del Liceu (La clemenza di Tito), the Metropolitan Opera (Maria Stuarda), and Seville's Teatro de la Maestranza (La traviata). She designed lighting at Lyric for Il trovatore (2018/19, 2014/15, 2006/07), and for Romeo and Juliet (La Scala), David Lang's The LoseOr (LA Opera), The Magic Flute (Tokyo's New National Theatre), The Age of Anxiety (Royal Ballet), and Harold Pinter's The Room (Wooster Group). Her recent work in theater includes To Kill a Mockingbird for London and on tour, Beckett's First Love for ZOOM, and all of Richard Nelson's Rhinebeck Panorama plays. She is a past recipient of the Dorothy and Lillian Gish Prize, the Jerome Robbins Prize, and the Mayor's Award for Arts and Culture in New York City. In 2008 she was made a United States Artists "Gracie" Fellow and a MacArthur Fellow. In December 2019 she was named the 2019/20 Cage Cunningham Fellow by the Baryshnikov Arts Center. Jennifer Tipton is supported by The Mary-Louise and James S. Aagard Lighting



Director Endowed Chair.

JOSEPHINE LEE | CHILDREN'S CHORUS MASTER

Previously at Lyric: 14 productions since 2000/01, most recently *Tosca* (2021/22) and *The Queen of Spades* (2019/20).

As the president and artistic director of Uniting Voices Chicago (UVC, formerly the Chicago Children's Choir), Josephine Lee has revolutionized youth music education, infusing their experience with cutting-edge performances of diverse repertoire, ongoing partnerships with leading cultural institutions such as Lyric, Chicago Symphony Orchestra, and Ravinia Festival, and extensive national and international tours. For her work on the documentary *Songs on the Road to Freedom* (2008), Lee was honored with an Emmy Award. Among Lee's recent projects are two world premiere theatrical pieces (*Long Way Home* with

the Q Brothers Collective and *Sita Ram* with David Kersnar of Lookingglass Theatre), several collaborations with Chance the Rapper (including 2016's Grammy Award-winning project, *Coloring Book*), and an original piano and cello composition, *Ascension*, with choreographer Frank Chaves for Ballet Chicago in 2017. Lee earned a Grammy Award nomination as a soloist in the world premiere of Ted Hearne's *Place* at the Brooklyn Academy of Music Next Wave Festival (2018). In 2019, she conducted Lisa Fischer and members of the National Philharmonic at Strathmore. Lee founded Vocality in 2015, a festival chorus comprising young vocal artists from a wide array of communities in the city of Chicago. Among her current projects is a new theatrical work by David Kersnar, J. Nicole Brooks, and UVC composer-in-residence Mitchell Owens III.



LINDA DOBELL | ORIGINAL CHOREOGRAPHER

Previously at Lyric: The Queen of Spades (2019/20) and Hansel and Gretel (2012/13, 2001/02).

The late British actress/choreographer began her career in her teens, performing in the original *Rocky Horror Show*. Onstage she was seen with many major companies, including Theatre Royal Stratford East, the National Theatre, the Young Vic, and the Royal Court Theatre. She made her Royal Opera debut in 1993 with *The Magic Flute*, returning for *Eugene Onegin* and Richard Jones's production of *Lady Macbeth of Mtsensk*. Among other major choreography credits were *Alice in Wonderland* (Royal Shakespeare Company) and *Così fan tutte*, *Peter Grimes*, and *The Magic Flute* (Scottish Opera).



In May of 1890, Mascagni's Cavalleria Rusticana had its premiere in Rome. Two years later, Leoncavallo's Pagliacci followed in Milan. Separately, or in double harness, these two pieces swept the opera houses of the world. Inflamed passions, violence, and verismo filled the lyric stage.

And then, two days before Christmas 1893, there appeared an alternative: Engelbert Humperdinck's Hansel and Gretel. As the influential music critic of the time, Eduard Hanslick, put it: "To the brutal miniatures, already becoming tiresome, the strongest possible contrast is—a children's fairy tale. On the one side we

have criminals, suicides, betrayed lovers and couples; on the other, a little brother and sister whose only pain is hunger and whose greatest pleasure is a candy bar no passion, no love story, no love intrigue. It is another world—and a better one."

Ironically, as Hanslick realized. this innocent tale was composed by a musician under the spell of the arch-sorcerer Richard Wagner, who, Hanslick believed, had poisoned the pure fonts of lyric art. A thorough command of Wagner's technical apparatus underlies Hansel and Gretel. "The restless modulation...the polyphonic texture of the accompaniment...the refined orchestral effects—this is Richard Wagner to the core," wrote Hanslick. Humperdinck, a brilliant,

prizewinning young musician of 25, met Wagner in Naples in 1879. Wagner invited him to Bayreuth to help in the preparation of Parsifal, and a few measures of that score have been ascribed to Humperdinck. (The transformation scene took slightly longer to stage than there was music for; the assistant devised some extra measures, and Wagner approved of them.) In 1880 he wrote an orchestral piece, Humoreske, which had a certain success. But he was not a prolific composer. After Bayreuth, he held various teaching posts, including two years as a professor of theory at the Barcelona Conservatory, and in 1890 Cosima Wagner engaged him to complete the musical education of her son Siegfried. That same year, Humperdinck's sister, Adelheid

Wette, asked him to compose some songs for a domestic entertainment she had written for her children to perform.

With mock-Wagnerian pomposity this little drawing-room play was presented as "A Nursery Dedicatory Festival Drama." (Parsifal had been a "Bühnenweihfestspiel"; Hansel was a "Kinderstuben-Weihfestspiel.") Now Humperdinck was looking for an opera libretto, and it occurred to him that his sister's play could be expanded to provide one. Thus Hansel and Gretel came into being. Fairy tales, as everyone knows, can be allegories of real life. The Magic Flute is a fairy tale, and so

The gentle Adelheid Wette was shocked at such callous behavior and tried to soften it. In her version the mother comes home after a tiring and profitless day. The children have been larking, not working. When, in a scuffle, the milk jug is broken and the only nourishment in the

house is spilt, she drives them out into the forest to gather strawberries in a sudden, understandable burst of temper and despair. In its own way, this first scene is also very realistic, and there is more than a hint that the father, even though (or because!) his day has been profitable, has been drinking on the way home. Poverty, hunger, cares that have turned a mother's love to harshness—all is set for a domestic tragedy. But then Hansel and Gretel becomes an epic. Food may be a recurrent preoccupation—for the parents, for the children, for the greedy old child-eating Witch—but the theme is the outwitting of an ogress by two resourceful and spirited children. The Witch who has transformed her earlier little victims into gingerbread

is a homely descendant of the enchantress Circe in *The Odyssey*, who turned Ulysses's companions into swine, and of the enchantress Alcina in Ariosto's *Orlando Furioso*, who turned her admirers into savage beasts. Many morals can be drawn from *Hansel and Gretel*—but not, perhaps, the one that is sung out, maestoso, in its closing pages: "When in need or dark despair, God will surely hear our prayer." The broad chorale makes a superb and moving musical close to the work—but heaven has played no part in the rescue of Hansel and Gretel or the awakening of the spellbound children. They are saved by their own wits.

In fact, heaven's role is distinctly ambiguous. At the close of the forest scene, the pious tots sing their evening prayer before settling down to sleep. Fourteen angels appear to keep watch over them, and Humperdinck clothes the Dream Pantomime in music of shining, ethereal beauty. But when day dawns, the angel sentries are gone. They were as a dream. The children are left to face the menace of the Witch. Hansel and Gretel is a Wagnerian music drama with nursery subject matter. When the milk jug is broken, the orchestral climax could accompany the shattering of Wotan's spear. The Witch's Ride is a Ride of the Valkyries, but with broomsticks for

mounts, instead of magic horses. The shining Dream Pantomime owes something to *Lohengrin*, and perhaps more to *Parsifal*. The finale, the awakening of the children, is in effect an apotheosis and redemption. There have been people disturbed by, and critical of, the application of Wagner's elaborate methods to so slight a tale. But most people have loved *Hansel and Gretel*—loved it as children, and loved it perhaps even more as adults.

And they do so for two reasons. First, because they can still share in the realities of its emotions. (The forest terrors that scare Gretel, in the second scene, are kin to those that scare Mime in the *Ring*; anyone who has been alone in a forest at night must know them.)

And second, because the music is so captivatingly beautiful. Humperdinck uses the same size orchestra as Wagner in *Die Meistersinger*, but there is no heaviness in his handling of it—only richness, warmth, delicacy, and (to quote the critic Robin Legge) "once or twice, as in the twilit woodland scene with the cuckoo, a poetry more enchanting than anything of the kind ever achieved by Wagner."

Director's note

Eric Einhorn talks about bringing hunger and temptation to life on stage

How would you define original director Richard Jones's vision for this piece? It's a meditation on both the lack and the overabundance of food, and how people handle both of those situations. It's certainly a dark telling of the story and very much in line with the Grimm Brothers. It has their same undercurrent of darkness, which has lightened a bit in the time since the story was written. Richard deals with the narrative as reality, rather than as a fairytale—but the production still does take us to the psychological root of the fairy tale, on a dark journey through the woods and out again.

The stage definitely recalls England post World War II, doesn't it? Yes, it certainly evokes that time of deprivation. But it's presented by Richard and the designer, John Macfarlane, in a non-literal way, making it easily identifiable and immediate for audiences. A universal visual world.

Hunger really is the operative idea here. And the opening scene is so much about that. The two children, alone and hungry, are seen in crisis. It's the umpteenth day that they've been left with little or nothing to eat, and that really kicks off everything. It drives these kids to the events of the opera.

The adult singers playing the children move more convincingly than in any other version I've seen.

Richard was adamant about creating very specific physical characterizations of the kids. It's a late child/early adolescent movement, with that awkwardness and self-discovery. Because of their hunger and also because of certain distinct character traits, the kids behave in particular ways. In Richard's concept, Hansel is a very obsessive child, with repetitive gestures and actions with props and doors in the first scene. The character is rooted in this physicality and carries it through the show.

What about Gretel? She's a pre-adolescent witch. During rehearsals for the Met revival, Richard spoke quite a bit about Gretel having powers that she doesn't know what to do with yet. When she finds herself in the Witch's kitchen and witnesses the spells, she immediately takes to them. In this production, the Witch is defeated in a power shift; she's leaving the world, but in her place is Gretel. It's a bit *Lord of the Flies*—you give children power and what happens? Are we innately good or innately bad? It's a subtle point, but like so much of what Richard does in this production, it gives the performer a real anchor.

Can we talk about the different images of plates, which are so important? The theme of the show being hunger, there are repetitive images of plates on painted drops: full, empty, broken, and bloody. Their primary task is to mask scene changes, but they're also a way to track the hunger narrative.

What can you tell our audience about the different sets? All three are versions of the same thing—a room with a sink, a table, and an oven or stove. Here again, this is to drive home the idea of hunger. These kids are in the same situation wherever they go. They are on a journey. But that journey is rooted in their quest for food.

In the forest scene, this production gives us a very original idea of both the Sandman and the Dew Fairy. The Sandman is a simple and very old man. He lives in the woods—the kind of guy who just walks his dog through the woods and sells sleep to people who need it. Actually, he's exhausted and can't get any sleep himself. But this is his job! And the Dew Fairy is the young mother that Hansel and Gretel always wanted—your perfect "Donna Reed mom."

And speaking of television personalities—was it intentional to make the Witch a nightmarish version of Julia Child? Yes, completely intentional. Richard also wanted to play the duality of the Witch—both the sweet lady next door and the villainesse who can turn on a dime. I like to think of her as a pressure cooker, with that intense darkness always bubbling beneath the surface. Sometimes she accidentally lets it out, when she gets a little too excited by the prospect of eating these children. You see her look turn from sweet to disgusting and evil, but then she stifles it because she can't expose that side of herself and still get what she wants.

She also operates out of a spectacular industrial strength kitchen! The stage looks like a child's birthday party gone crazy, with piles of food, cone shaped paper party hats, and a childlike painted tablecloth—all within a kitchen out of a horror movie. What's amazing about that image is that it makes the point for Hansel and Gretel, but also for us, that we see what we want to see. In this otherwise dark and dirty place is this oasis of sugar—a table full of cake. Our wildest dreams come true.

Beyond the stage

Planting a seed

Lyric's Learning and Creative Engagement team has re-launched its popular and influential program that brings students to dress rehearsals.

You may be surprised to hear that this production of Englebert Humperdinck's Hansel and Gretel has been seen before. Not only a decade ago, when the show had a successful run at Lyric Opera of Chicago, but also just a few days before the opening, when students from Chicago Public Schools had a chance to enjoy the production's full dress rehearsal. Those performances have a slightly more casual feel (a good thing, for introducing young people to the art form), but they also offer all the splendor of a regular show—the full orchestra, lush costumes, and, of course, dazzling melodies and singing. "It's so fun to watch young people walk into the space for the first time," says Elise LaBarge, Lyric's Learning Programs Manager—and of course that's exactly the point. What better place to begin nurturing a lifelong love of opera than in one of its grandest houses?

The CPS dress rehearsal program goes back as far as 2012, when Lyric's Learning and Creative Engagement team was formed. The company had long offered special

performances and education opportunities for students across the city, but the past decade has seen tremendous growth and development. There are matinees and other exclusive performances for students, a wide range of streaming options, opera residencies, and the *Opera in the Neighborhoods* program, which brings youth-focused works to the places where young people and their families live. But perhaps none provide quite so much excitement as an afternoon field trip to see the company in action.

Typically, Lyric has offered CPS students access to dress rehearsals throughout the entirety of a season, though the pandemic of course halted this initiative. The logistics of the reboot are daunting and fall mainly into the hands of Anthony Jones, who joined Lyric as a program coordinator in the Lyric Unlimited office, the company's division of Learning and Creative Engagement, in 2022. With a background in vocal performance and assistant teaching, Jones is no stranger to the world of creative engagement, and he has been enjoying all the challenges of making the dress rehearsal program work. He had

something of a practice run himself, when Lyric managed to invite students from several schools to attend a dress rehearsal for the hit *Fiddler on the Roof* earlier this season.

Throughout the afternoon, Jones could sense the students' excitement and curiosity. "I feel like a lot of students are surprised by dress rehearsals," he says. "Fiddler is such an energetic show, and I heard students ask 'How did they do that?'" That sort of curiosity is often the first step for many of these students as they begin their artistic journey. The inside look at the inner workings of the arts can plant a seed for generations to come.

Hansel and Gretel offered the first official opportunity in two seasons to bring the program back and enthusiasm ran high. Months in advance of the dress rehearsal for Hansel and Gretel, the Learning and Creative Engagement team had reserved more than 1,645 seats for students and teachers. For schools where travel can be a barrier, Lyric offers bus scholarships that cover the cost of transportation to and from the opera house.

"The Spring rollout is so exciting, for students and for everyone," Jones says. "And given the nature of the story, I expect *Hansel and Gretel* will be especially interesting."

Amy Cholod, music teacher at Hitch Elementary and a CPS arts liaison, agrees. A former opera singer, and an educator for more than 20 years, Cholod saw Lyric's original production of *Hansel and Gretel* back in 2012 and can't wait to share the experience with her students this season. She considers such efforts essential. "We live in a beautiful city with world-class opera," she notes.

Cholod helped initiate the partnership with Lyric in 2018, and today Hitch Elementary is participating in two Elementary Opera Residencies, and an Opera Discovery Project—and she's planning visits to the opera house for dress rehearsals. She says some of her former students now perform at theaters and opera houses around the country—and she knows experiences like visiting the opera house planted the seed in those young talents.

To keep opera a must-see, must-hear experience, the art form needs outstanding artists who can convey through singing and acting the emotional range and engaging storytelling that are opera's hallmarks. Lyric, through The Patrick G. and Shirley W. Ryan Opera Center, identifies exceptionally talented emerging artists from around the world and provides them with comprehensive training and performance opportunities. On the world's stages, the Center's impressive roster of alumni continually proves the value of training at Lyric.





People of Lyric

Sarah Cohn Manager, Chorus and Dancers



WHAT IS YOUR ROLE HERE AT LYRIC, AND HOW LONG HAVE YOU BEEN IN THIS POSITION?

I started in 2019 as the Music Administration Associate. Chorus, and then in the summer of 2021 I became the Manager, Chorus & Dancers. I oversee our Chorus, which consists of our Regular Chorus (Lyric's full-time, tenured Chorus); the Core Supplementary Chorus (the singers we first reach out to when we need a bigger group for a particular production); and the Supplementary Chorus (for our biggest shows, like this season's Ernani, Don Carlos, and Carmen). I also oversee our dancers each season. As a result, I plan auditions for both sets of artists, working regularly with our Chorus Master Michael Black, our Ballet Mistress August Tye, and with various guest choreographers on hiring and rosters. I also deal with nuts-andbolts personnel and payroll matters. A large component of my job is to work very closely with our AGMA union colleagues in dealing with everything from small day-to-day issues all the way up to contract negotiations.

WHAT KEEPS YOU COMMITTED TO THE WORK YOU DO?

The people. I love the members of our Chorus and I love our dancers, and I enjoy working with our Chorus Master and the different choreographers who come to work here. I try to be an advocate for them. I also think that there's a larger reason why I chose to work in opera instead of other art forms: Once you get past the grandness of it, opera is very intimate and personal. In this technology-fueled world, I love that there are no microphones, just the human voice and the human body. That makes for a thrilling kind of storytelling.

WHAT LED YOU TO LYRIC?

I am a violist by training, but I came to realize in high school that I was not going to pursue music professionally. The summer before I went to college, I interned at my small hometown opera company, even though at that point I had never seen an opera. But I loved theater and I loved music and I loved language, and I soon fell in love with opera since it's a combination of all three. Then I discovered administration as a way that I could stay involved in the arts in a role that was much better suited to my personality and temperament.

I graduated from Columbia University and started working in the Vocal Arts Department of The Juilliard School. After about a decade of living in New York I started thinking about a life beyond the city, and Lyric was high on my radar as a great company to work for. When I saw a job open up here and was lucky enough to get it, I moved to Chicago.

WHAT IS THE MOST CHALLENGING ASPECT OF YOUR JOB?

A big challenge I face and embrace is working with so many different types of artists, from chorus members to dancers, who all have specific skills and needs, and aligning those with the goals and vision of our creative teams and artistic leadership. It can be quite a balancing act, but we all have such a deep love for opera that we make it work.

BEYOND OPERA, WHAT ARE YOUR OTHER PASSIONS?

I am a distance runner—I ran my fifth Chicago Marathon in October 2021 and am always on the lookout for my next big race. There are many parallels between opera and marathons. You train and train, and then put everything on the starting line or on the stage. You show up for the important moments. And both take quite the endurance!

A FAVORITE LYRIC MOMENT?

I think the one that comes to mind was during our season-opening performances of *Macbeth* last season. There is a big choral number, "Patria oppressa," towards the end of the opera. I would always sneak into the back of the house to listen in person. After working on so many film projects when we couldn't do mainstage performances during COVID, to finally come back into the theater and hear this huge chorus all singing together in person was a great reminder of why we do what we do. This moment said so much about why we persevered through all the stresses of the pandemic. This is why we do it, and it's worth it.
